

ASSIGNMENT DETAILS

- Your first draft is due in class on <u>Friday, May 31st, 2019</u> (late assignments will receive half points – maximum of 2.5)
- The first draft assignment is worth 5 points. The combined total for the assignment on the grading rubric is 21 points. Your score (the number of points you earn) will be converted to a percentage, which will then be converted to a final score out of 5.

Example 15 points = 71% of 21; which equals 3.6 out of 5

DRAFT REQUIREMENTS

Your first draft does not have to be perfect and may contain some errors; however the essay must show the following components:

- 1. A cover/title page containing the title of your essay, your name, student number, course name, and the professor's name
- 2. An introduction paragraph which
 - a. identifies the general topic;
 - b. provides some background information to help establish/clarify the issue;
 - c. and offers a thesis statement identifying the main point of the essay
- 3. A sufficient number of body (support) paragraphs which
 - a. provide clear examples and information that support the thesis;
 - b. cite relevant sources (i.e. in-text citations) to help highlight or strengthen key points
- 4. **A conclusion** that brings the essay to a close.
- 5. A reference list containing details (Author's name, title of work, date of publication, publisher, etc.) of the sources you have found and used so far you should have at least 3 sources in English (required) as well as any other sources in other languages (optional).

NOTE: The essay is also graded based on the **sources** you have selected as well as the **originality and critical thinking** shown in your writing. Refer to the grading rubric for additional information on how these components will be assessed.
